If the line to Moses is long, can you imagine the line to talk to Jesus about His ministry? John said, “there are also many other things which Jesus did, which if they were written in detail, I suppose that even the world itself would not contain the books that would be written.” (**Joh 21:25**)

We will have lots to say to our heroes of faith we know the best but what about the prophets like Nahum, Amos, Obadiah, and Hosea? Do you have questions you would like to ask them? What if some of these men asked you a question - “How did God’s word in my book help you on your journey to heaven?” Could we give them a good answer?

I’m afraid too many christians would not be able to tell these great men of faith how what they wrote for our encouragement helped us at all. I’m afraid there are too many christians that have never studied these great books in detail. May that not describe us! May we be able to give them an answer as well as a “thank you.”

Paul told Timothy, “You, however, continue in the things you have learned and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*, and that from childhood you have known the sacred writings which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.” (**2Ti 3:14-15**) I’m sure Timothy was taught these great books from Joel, Micah, and Haggai that gave him “the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith.”

God gave us these wonderful books to help us in our walk with Him. May we use them and study them and thank God for them. Then we can have a list of questions to ask these prophets in heaven.
