destroyed. He did not want them to be unaware so they could flee Jerusalem when they saw the signs of its impending destruction. Jesus transitions from discussing the destruction of Jerusalem to the final judgement. He tells us, "Therefore be on the alert, for you do not know which day your Lord is coming. But be sure of this, that if the head of the house had known at what time of the night the thief was coming, he would have been on the alert and would not have allowed his house to be broken into. For this reason you also must be ready; for the Son of Man is coming at an hour when you do not think He will." (Mat 24:42-44)

Are you ready for the Son of Man to come? If you are not, you need to get ready. Maybe you have not committed your life to the Lord and been baptized for the remission of your sins. Maybe you are living in sin and need to repent and start living for God. Whatever you need to do to get ready, do it today!

In Jesus' example of the thief, Jesus makes the point that the thief is not going to tell the owner of the house the day he is planning on stealing some items from his home. The point is we need to always be ready; if we are, there is no need to worry about the thief coming.

The better question for me is not if I'm ready for the coming of child number four but if I'm ready for Jesus' coming. Are we making the necessary arrangements and preparations for Jesus' coming? He is coming like a thief in the night and at an hour when people do not think He will make His arrival. May we get our spiritual lives in order so we can be ready when He says, "Ready or not, here I come!"
