Do Not Be Deceived

When God created the garden of Eden, He "caused to grow every tree that is pleasing to the sight and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil." (**Gen 2:8**) This must have been the most beautiful garden ever to exist. Think of the wonderful smells and sights this garden produced.

God put Adam in the midst of the garden to cultivate it and keep it. He told Adam, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."
