### **Growing In Wisdom**

Wisdom is absolutely critical in living a righteous and pleasing life before God. Five books of the Old Testament are under the umbrella of "Wisdom" Literature" (also called "books of poetry"). Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon are all books focused on helping us live of life based on wisdom.

The book of **Job** is a story about a man who was the greatest of all the people in the east. Satan challenged God by saying this man worships you because you give him everything. God allowed Satan to take away all of his possessions and then his good health and yet he stayed righteous and blameless before God. It is a book teaching us the mindset we need to have when we go through difficult trials in our own life. James sums up the lesson of Job in this way, "Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful." (James 5:11)

The book of **Psalms** are a collection of prayers and hymns for God's people. Many of them were written by by David but it goes all the way back to the time of Moses (Psalm 90). In this book we learn how

to better pray and rely on God. The Psalmists express to God their concerns and emotions which we can easily relate to and learn from.

The book of **Proverbs** is a book dedicated to helping us live a life in the fear of the Lord. God gives us great insight to help us walk on the right path, a path pleasing to God. It is one of the most practical books in the entire bible.

The book of **Ecclesiastes** is authored by Solomon whom God said, "I have given you a wise and discerning heart, so that there has been no one like you before you, nor shall one like you arise after you." (**1Ki 3:12**) He explores the question of what is this life all about. If we learn from this book, we will stop waisting time pursuing the things under the sun and focus on pleasing our Creator.
